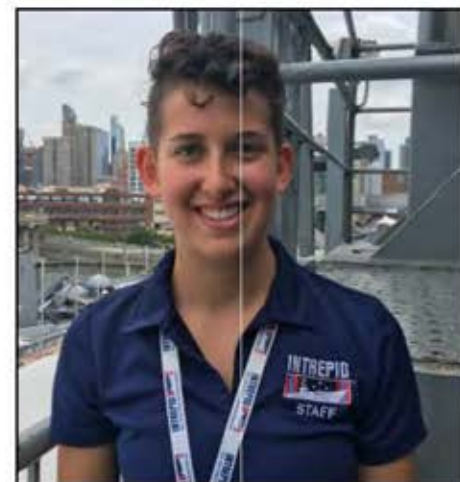
I will say “Goodbye” to the person that brought me to Intrepid and say “Hello” to the Camp educators.

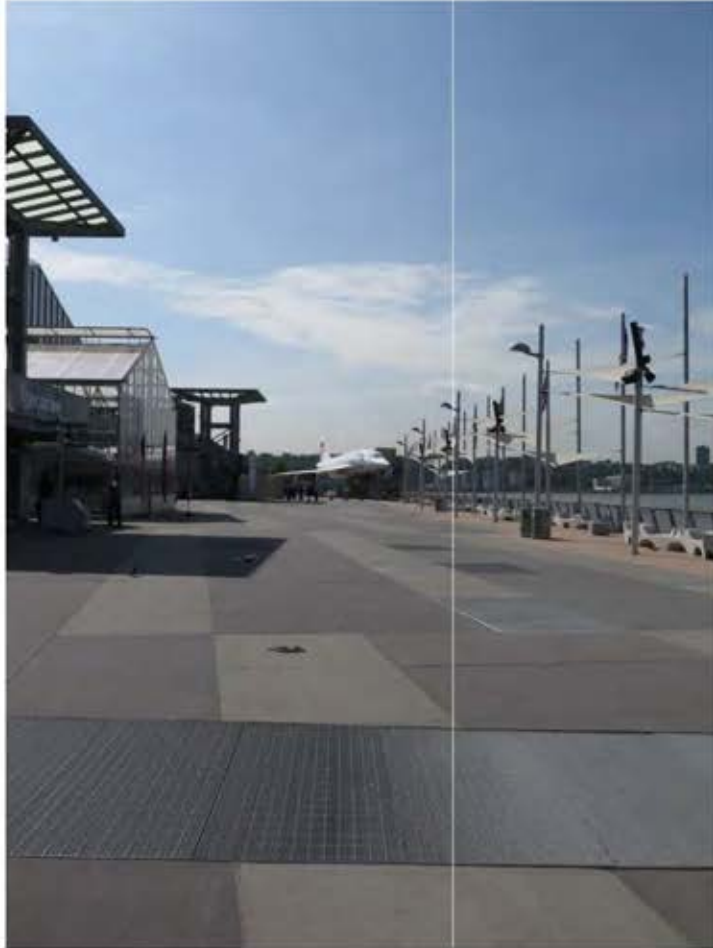

On Tuesday, we will meet aircraft restoration specialists. They will show us how they fix the Museum's aircraft. We will practice using their tools.

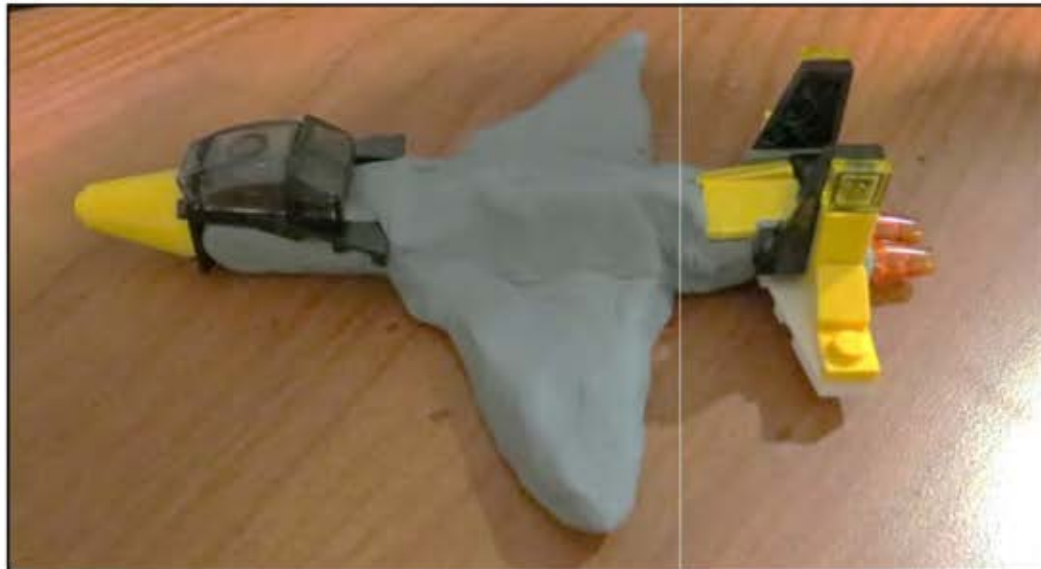
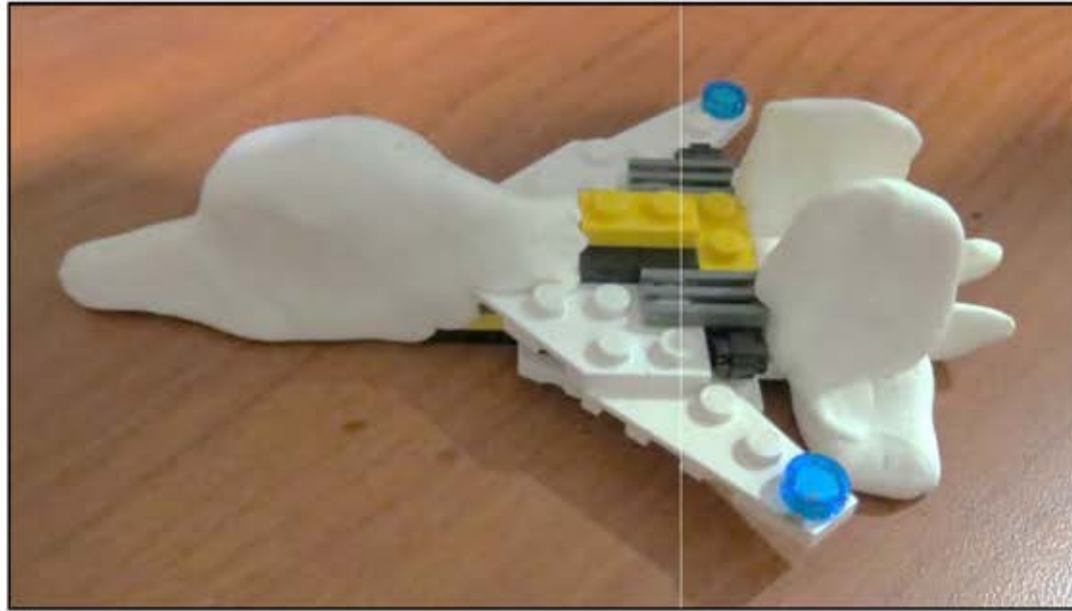

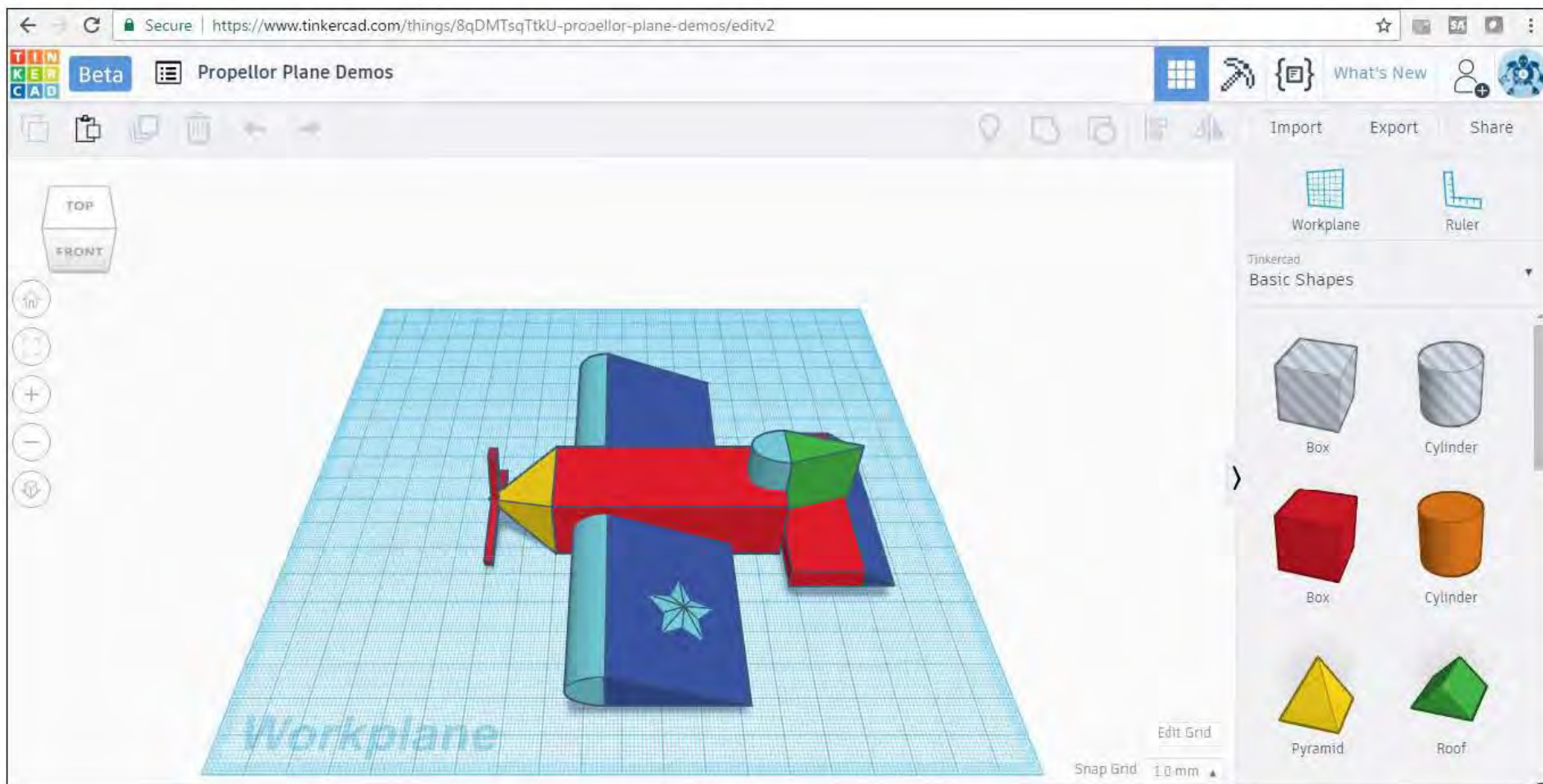


Dina preparing to paint an airplane with stencils.

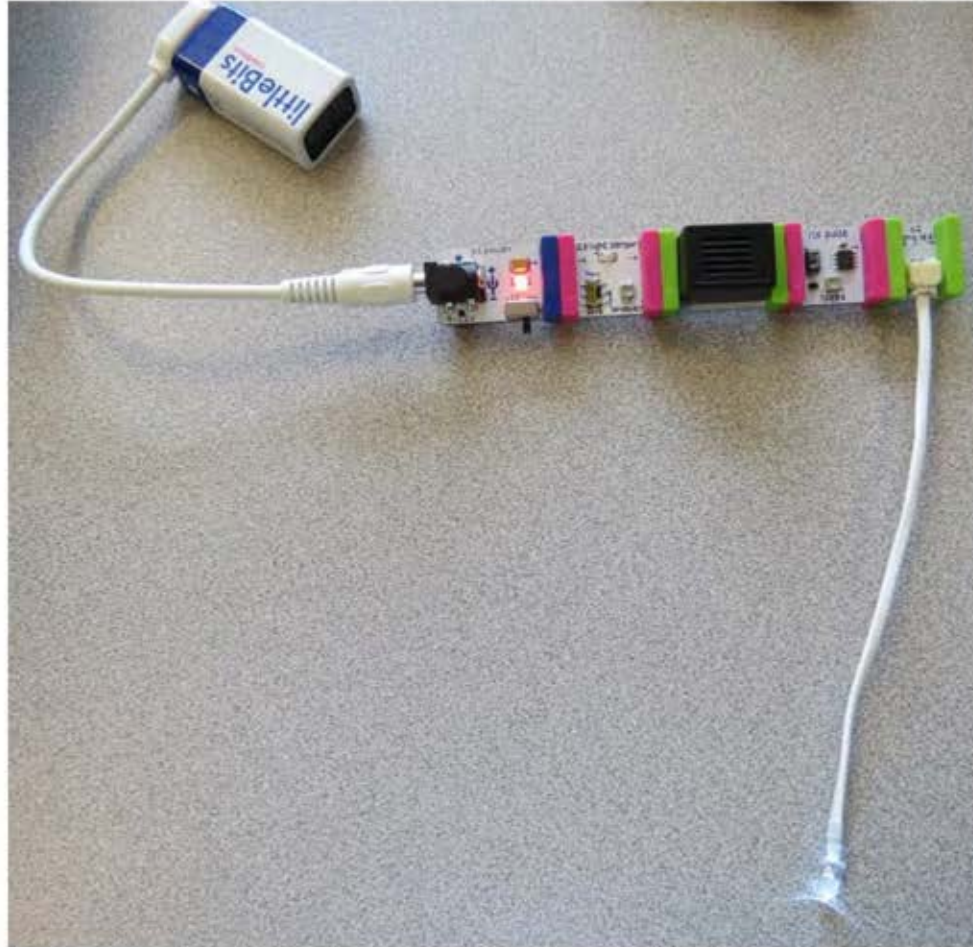
International Space Station (ISS)



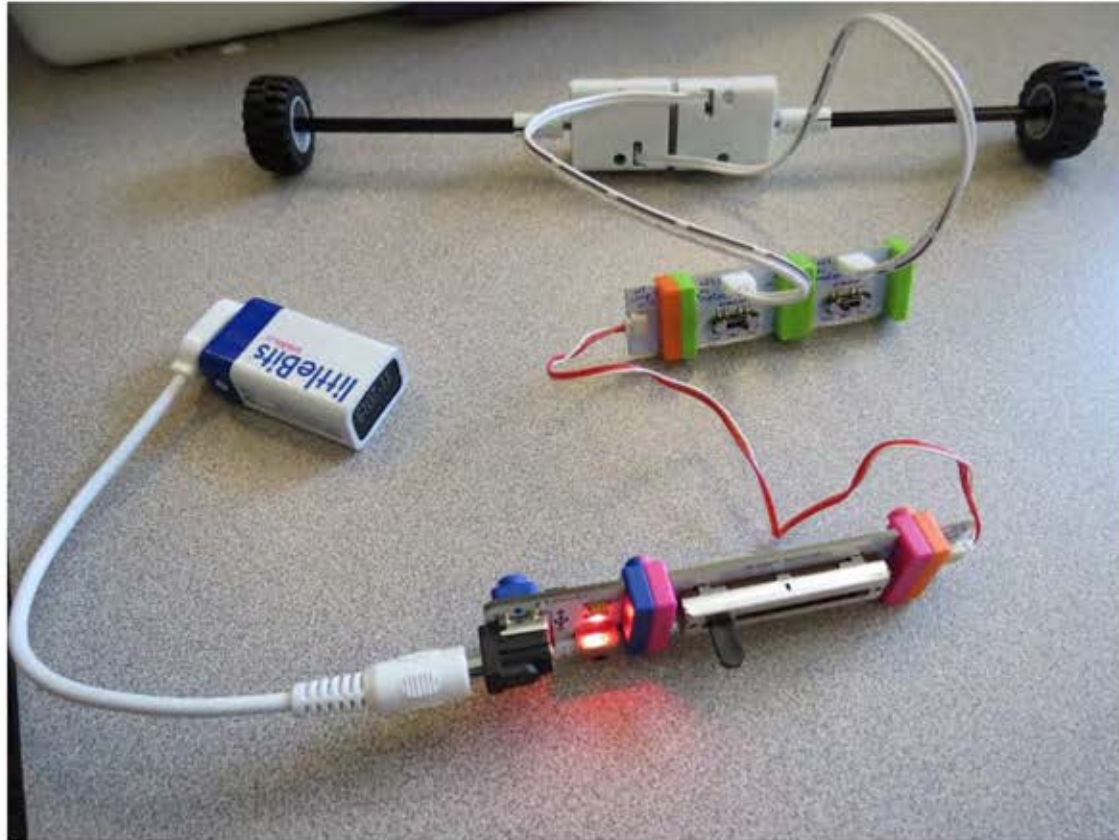

Camp will give me snacks, but I will bring and eat my lunch from home.

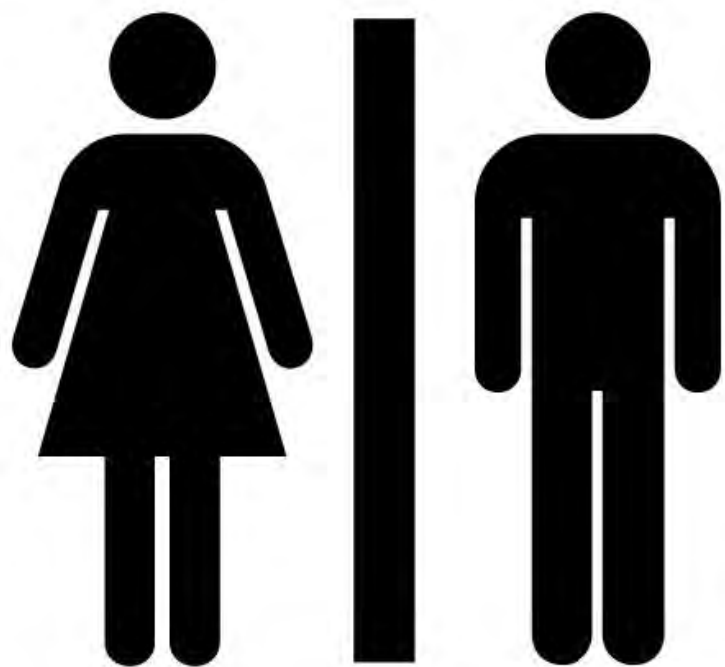
Throughout the day, we will have movement breaks.
